



The B Reactor is a National Historic Landmark giving visitors the chance to walk through the world's first full-scale nuclear reactor. This facility produced the plutonium for the "Fat Man" bomb which was dropped over Nagasaki, Japan in August of 1945, and helped to end World War II.

This is approximately a four and a half hour (4.5) tour, with about two hours allocated for touring the B Reactor itself.

All Visitors must be a least 12 years if age to participate in a B Reactor tour. If less than 18 years of age, a parent/guardian will need to sign a release form indicating that they are aware of the potential hazards and their responsibilities for supervision of the child.

Visitors do not have to be a U.S. citizen to participate in the tour.

There is no charge for the tour.

This tour will be on a first-come first-served basis.
